**ARTICLE 21:**

To see if the Town will vote to amend the General By-Law Section 14-2. List of persons authorized to respond to alarm, by deleting the following sentence.

~~Every alarm user shall submit to the Police Chief the names and telephone numbers of at least two other persons who are authorized to respond to an emergency signal transmitted by an alarm system and who can open the premises wherein the alarm system is installed.~~

And by adding the following sentences in its place:

On a form provided by the Police Chief, the owner and individual responsible for the Alarm System shall provide the name, phone number, address and any other relevant information as requested, for him/herself and the same for at least two other persons who are authorized to respond to an emergency signal transmitted by an alarm system and who can open the premises wherein the alarm system is installed. The individual responsible for the Alarm System will be solely responsible regarding any by-law violations.

Rea: Article 21 – Alarm By-Law


