For the Household

What are sharps?

- "Having the potential to puncture or lacerate"
- Including (but not limited to) needles, syringes, lancets, auto injectors, infusion sets, connection needles/sets
- May be used to manage medical conditions of people & pets

Improper Disposal of Sharps

- Can threaten public safety sharps contaminated with Hepatitis, HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus), and/or other serious or fatal diseases can accidentally stick people
- · Can clog sewers and lift stations
- · Can end up at recycling centers

Concession in which the

 Can puncture solid waste containers, putting workers along collection routes and at landfills at risk of injury and/or disease

How do I dispose of sharps?

- Used sharps should be immediately placed in a sharps container (now available for pickup at both Sandwich Street Fire Station & Plymouth Public Health Department)
- If unable to get approved container, a heavy duty plastic household container (such as a laundry detergent container or milk jug) may be used.
- Bring full sharps container to the Plymouth Fire Station.

Importance of Proper Sharps Disposal

- Decrease risk of injury to yourself and others
- Decrease risk of infection from:
 - Hepatitis B
 - Hepatitis C
 - Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV)

Medical Waste

Where do needles and sharps come from?

- 9 million syringe users will administer at least 3 billion injections outside a traditional health care facility per year
- 2/3 of these injectors are people with diabetes or patients administering home health treatment for other conditions, such as epipens being used for allergies

How can I dispose of needles?

- · Place into a sharps container
- If no sharps container, throw sharps into a hard plastic container (like a laundry detergent container) UNTIL 3/4 FULL, write SHARPS - DO NOT RECYCLE, and secure with a lid (tape shut if necessary)
- When container is 3/4 full, bring to a sharps drop-off station
- · NEVER DISPOSE IN TRASH OR TOILET
