

“5. The ADU shall not exceed 700 gross square feet in size or 25% of the GFA of the Single-Family Residence to which it is accessory, whichever is less;”

Any premium received by the Town upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this vote, less any premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds and notes, may be applied to the payment of costs approved by this vote in accordance with M.G.L. Chapter 44, Section 20, thereby reducing the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay such costs by a like amount.
